Since our visionary founders first engaged in their robust, creative discussions about increasing access to life-saving specialty care, Project Access Northwest has grown into a critically important organization in the Pacific Northwest. It's a local health care solution that works—for patients in need, providers, partners and the greater community. **Project Access Northwest is a living narrative of action that has changed the lives of more than 44,000 patients.**

- For our Patients: We reduce health care costs and help patients get healthy and stay that way through our Care Coordination, Premium Assistance and Health Home programs.
- For our Providers: We handle the administrative details so our providers' valuable time is focused on delivering life-changing care.
- For our Partners: We offer localized solutions for specific patient care challenges.
- For our Community: We serve as part of the critical safety net ensuring that unmet health needs aren't leaving people vulnerable to long-term issues, hunger or homelessness.

Without Project Access Northwest, our 44,000+ patients—roughly enough to fill every seat in Safeco Field—would have gone without essential care.

As this report goes to press, Project Access Northwest has mobilized more than 1700 volunteer providers and in 2017 alone served more than 5,000 people in need. **Even so, we need to do more.**

A real problem does not solve itself—and today, despite the efforts around health care at both the state and federal levels, **there are people in our service area who simply fall through the cracks of our system.**

POWERFUL RESULTS: New research reveals the impact of each donor dollar


Our average care coordination expense of \$325 delivers life-changing health care to our patients in need—at no cost to them.

Our donor dollars deliver!

With expert guidance from our board member **Dan Howell**, of West Monroe Partners, we are measuring the impact of each donor dollar. Depending on the care patients need, that initial investment yields big returns:

- Podiatry patients receive an average of \$2,372 in care (7X return)
- Gastroenterology patients receive an average of \$3,480 in care (10X return)
- Orthopedics patients receive an average of \$4,563 in care (14X return)


QUALITY HEALTH FOR ALL



Change in leadership

In June 2017, founding director Sallie Neillie retired, and the board selected Gary Renville to lead the organization as its new executive director. Gary brings an extensive background leading non-profit organizations. He has introduced a donorcentered fundraising focus, sounded the call for supporters to share their "time, talent and treasure," realigned staff roles and responsibilities, and shared new ways board members can take a more active role in supporting the organization's mission.

Health Home

In partnership with Coordinated Care, Project Access Northwest launched the Health Home



Program, which provides intensive, home-based, care coordination services for individuals with one or more chronic conditions. Care Coordinators met with 270 new clients to provide assessments and create personalized Health Action Plans centered around personal goals. Care Coordinators also provided 733 face-to-face follow-up appointments.

Dental services Project Access Northwest successfully transitioned

Swedish Community Specialty Clinic in June 2017. We continue our work with **Northwest Kidney Center** clients and the **Snohomish dental program**. With a grant from **Arcora Foundation**, we also began exploring new, sustainable ways to deliver dental care to low-income patients.





98% of our South Snohomish County patients were uninsured Patient Gender




